

2 of 2 review helpful You want to read this book By Elizabeth Armstrong Thomas Aikenhead the last person executed for blasphemy in Britain was a typical 18 year old university student he was questioning the received wisdom of his time and throwing around ideas which might have appeared somewhat subversive while in the company of his fellow students He wasn't the only young person who did so but unlike many of his comp This is the first modern book length study of the case of Thomas Aikenhead the sometime University of Edinburgh student who in 1697 earned the unfortunate distinction of being the last person executed for blasphemy in Britain Taking a micro historical approach Michael Graham uses the Aikenhead case to open a window into the world of Edinburgh Scotland and Britain in its transition from the confessional era of the Reformation and the covenants which placed high emphasis
