

years about burgh life in Scottish Medieval settlements. Sites listed include Perth and Scotland's towns are almost unique in Western Europe. They do not derive from Roman models but grew from planned medieval burghs. The first of these were founded by David I in the 12th century and includes towns like Perth, Aberdeen, Elgin, Edinburgh and Glasgow. This is the first popular synthesis to be attempted of what life was like in these new communities not simply with regard to houses, clothes and lifestyles but also in relation to the religious houses which p.
